DISABILITY DOCUMENTATION

Definition of Disability

An individual must demonstrate that his/her condition meets the definition a disability under the Rehabilitation Act, 1973 and/or the Americans with Disability Act(ADA), 1990 The ADA defines a disability as a physical mental impairment that substantially limits oner more major life activities.

Substantially limitsunder ADA refeto significant restrictionasto the condition, manner, or duration under whichan individual can perform a particular major lifectivity as compared to most people.

Whether a condition substantially limiting to support an accommodation requests a decision made by qualified professional(s) based upon multiple source information.

A clinical diagnosis not synonymous with a disability. The specific symptoms almatpresent shouldbe stated in the documentation. Evidence that these symptoms associated with substantial impairment a major life activitys required for provision accommodations. Systemic Disorders

Systemic disabilities re conditions affecting oner more of the body's systems, including the spiratory, immunological, neurological, circulatory, digestive systems. Systemic disabilities often unstable therefore, the need for and type reasonable accommodations may change time.
